18th October, Friday, Inauguration Day 1

1000 - Crafts' Village Opens

1900 - Inauguration by **Dr. M. Verappa Moily**, H'ble Union Minister for Petroleum & Natural Gas, Govt. of India.

Sh. Sudhir Vasudeva, CMD, ONGC Group of Companies, to preside.

1930 - Jagar by **Basanti Devi Bisht** and processional performance of Cholia Nritya from Kumaon

Basanti Devi Bisht is the sole female exponent of the Jagars or night vigil songs of the patron goddess of the mountains, Nanda Devi. She has extensively recorded and written about these songs. Her Maangal invocations mark the auspicious beginnings for the festival.

Cholia Dance from Kumaon

1945 - "An invocation to light" followed by "Om-Purusha-Prakriti" & "Rumi's Whirling Dervishes" - **Anaveshna Contemporary Indian Dance** Group

Led by Sangeeta Sharma, arguably India's most vivacious contemporary dance group - Anaveshna has made its mark on the Indian dance scene with innovations such as aerial choreography. Anaveshna, present two short compositions depicting resurgence in the face of nature's fury.

2000 - Flute Recital by Pt. Hariprasad Chaurasia

Hari ji is India's iconic flautist and needs no introduction. His name has become synonymous with the Indian bamboo flute. He has dedicated a lifetime to serving music and his genius is acknowledged worldwide. Honoured with Padma Vibhushan, his work straddles genres and generations, with film music for classics under the Shiv-Hari banner, and contemporary as well as classical music.

2000 - Sufi Gayan by Wadali Bandhu

Hailing from the Guru-ki-Wadali village near Amritsar, Wadali's are the foremost Sufi singers from the country. Born into the 5th generation of musicians, they have been honoured by the Pamdmashri. Wadali Brothers share a special bond with the Virasat Festival and have been regulars.

One of the most soulful and mature voices of the country today, Sitaram is emerging as a leading concert performer. At the fetsival, he sings his own compositions and pays rich tributes to all time greats.

1900 - **Pandavani Gayan** singing and narration in the Pandavani style of Chattisgarh.

1930 - Ramman - Recitation from the Ramayana, Garhwal's UNESCO world heritage

2000 - Jugalbandi by **Pt. Ronu Majumdar** on the Hindustani Flute & **Mysore Manjunath** on the Carnatic Violin

Pt. Ronu Mazumdaris India's leading flautist. A purist of the Maihar tradition, he has also recorded with greats such as R.D. Burman, Gulzar, Khayyam etc. In 1994, he recorded for the Merchant Ivory film "In Custody" with Ustad Zakir Hussain holding the baton. Ronu runs a music school in Chicago.

A child prodigy, Dr. Mysore Manjunath is today recognized as a trail blazer in Carnatic Violin. He has performed across the world with most senior artistes of the world.

1900 - Maihar Band - Hindustani Classical Orchestra

Baba Allauddin Khan, the guru to three doyens of music - Ustad Ali Akbar Khan, Pt. Ravi Shankar and Annapurna Devi, in order to find employment for orphans of a severe famine, started India's first orchestra of classical music. The Maihar Band carries forward this rich legacy until today.

2000 - Sufi Music by Kavita Seth

Kavita Seth is the most evocative voice in the contemporary music scene. She shot to fame with her albums Kabirana-Sufiana, Bulleh Shah and Om. Some of her most memorable songs include "Iktara" from the movie "Wake Up Sid!" and "Tum hi ho Bandhu".

1800 - Musical Heritage of Gulab Bai, a presentation

Nuatanki has a rich tradition of narrative folk tunes. In fact Parsi Theatre and Modern Indian Cinema are a product of this art form. Gulab Bai, perhaps the most significant Nautanki artiste had a ric repertoire, which is presented through her daughter Madhu Agarwal.

2030 - A Tribute to Pt. Ravi Shankar - **Pt. Vishwa Mohan Bhatt** on the Slide Guitar *Pt. Vishwa Mohan Bhatt is an iconic name in Indian classical music that needs no introduction. Winner of two Grammys and the coveted Global India Music Award (GIMA), Pandit ji is the foremost disciple of the legend, Bharat Ratna Pt. Ravi Shankar. Through his concert, he pays rich tributes to the master.*

A graduate from IIT, Chennai, Aditya has mesmerised audiences with his flute playing.



1900 - Jijiya Dance from Bihar, Gangaur from Madhya Pradesh

2000 - World of Kabir and Sufi Saints by Mir Mukhtiyar Ali

Mir Mukhtiyar Ali comes from a little village named Bhuggal on India's western border with Pakistan. He represents the 26th straight generation of mirasi folk singers. His wide repertoire includes songs of the Sufi masters as well as the nirgun philosophy of Kabir.

1800 - Terah Tali from Rajasthan & Bam Lahiri from Haryana

1900 - "Ramayan" in the Odissi idiom by **Kiran Segal** & Group

It was with the revival of the theatre movement in India post independence that Kameshwar and Zohra Segal became a part of the Ananda Shankar Dance ensemble. Zohra went on to become the grand old lady of Indian theatre and their daughter Kiran took to Odissi. Here, she presents her choreographed presentation of the epic "Ramayan"

2000 - "Daleel-e-Seher" - An evening of Poetry Theatre

This collective of young voices from Mumbai, has been designed by **Sukant Panigrahi**, the well-known artiste who has worked on projects such as Gangajal, Heroine and Dev D. Poets who speak to us through theatre include Vimal Chandra Pandey, Dipankar Giri, Sheshnath Pandey, Arshad Shaikh, Durgesh Singh, Ajay Kishore Shaw & Lata S. Singh. Sutradhar and musicians include Manoj Santoshi, Prabhat Raghunandan and Anju Sharma. The presentation has been creatively produced, especially for Virasat, by **Anupama Bose**.

1900 - Folk Performances from Uttar Pradesh

1930 - "Pakhawaj Vrind" - Ensemble of Percussion Drums by Akhilesh Gundecha & Group Pakhawaj is India's most ancient drum, essential accompaniment to the Dhrupad form of singing, perhaps the world's oldest living tradition coming from the age of the Samved. Gundechas represent the foremost amongst the young generation of Dhrupad artistes. Here, in a concert specially designed for Virasat Festival, Akhilesh and co-drummers present an ensemble of percussion drums.

2030 - Hindustani Classical Vocal by Ashwini Bhide-Deshpande

Ashwini ji is India's seniormost vocalist today. A great scholar in her own right, she represents the Jaipur-Atrauli Gharana style of singing. Honoured with numerous accolades, she has been described as a "music scholar with the most beautiful voice" by none other than Pt. Ravi Shankar.

0400 - Closing of Lalit Kala Exhibitions and Camp

1900 - Sheraz Raharvarde & Group - ensemble from Iran

Raharvarde Parsian is an ensemble from Tehran, Iran, which represents the traditional folk and classical music of this nation that has strong ties with India and its musical tradition.

2000 - Ghazals & Geet by $\mbox{\bf Dr.}$ $\mbox{\bf Roshan Bharti}$

A scholar and a singer, Dr. Roshan Bharti's doctoral thesis was based on the life and works of Begum Akhtar. He has a masters' degree in music. He also carries with him the impeccable lineage of being one of the torch bearers of the Senia Gharana, a lineage passed on to him by his grandfather, Ustad Jamaal Khan.

1800 - Gwalior Gharana Hindustani Vocal Recital by Pt. Shounak Abhisheki

Shounak Abhisheki, the son and disciple of Maestro Pandit Jitendra Abhisheki. He is a vocalist who combines Agra and Jaipur styles of Hindustani Classical Music. Abhisheki trained under Smt. Kamaltai Tambe of the Jaipur Gharana. He performs for Virasat as a special tribute to his father.

1900 - Quawwali by Atta Bhag Kaley Khan & Group

For close to three decades, Atta Bhag sang with the legend of Quawwali, Ustad Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan. Today, leading his independent quawwali group, Atta Bhag represents the timeless tradition of Sufiana Quawwali.

31st, Thursday Day 14 1000 - Crafts' Village Opens

1900 - **Wahdat Rameez** & **Husnain Javed** sing traditional Sufi Music from the frontier Born into a musical family, the young duo represent the rich tradition of music from Pak Pattan, on the frontier.

2000 - Sitar Recital by Manju Nandan Mehta

Manju Nandan Mehta comes from the well-known Bhatt family of Jaipur. She learnt under the tutelage of Damodarlal Kabra and Pt. Ravi Shankar. She is a co-founder of the well known Saptak School of Music and the Saptak Festival of Baroda.

1st, Friday, Valedictory 1000 - Crafts' Village Opens

1900 - Kathak Kendra Repertory presents dance recital - Pt. Rajendra Gangnani & Group

1930 - "Nagamandala" - Dance Ballet by Anaveshana Dance Group with Dehradun based upcoming artistes

Nagamandala is a modern theatrical classic, penned by Girish Karnad. It receives treatment in the contemporary dance idiom through this presentation, which involves several dancers from Dehradun as well.

2000 - "The Susmit Sen Chronicles" - Ensemble performance by Shushmit Sen and group.

India's best known guitarist, Susmit, tasted unprecedented success through the band he founded - Indian Ocean. Susmit, after a long innings, with albums such as Kandisa and Desert Rain and music in cult films like Black Friday and Pipli Live, decided to start out once again with his ensemble, the Susmit Sen Chronicles.
